Pastor Alan's talks are interesting, informative and it is a great time to enjoy the fellowship of members and friends. **Please come join us.**

"Jesus Interprets His Own Person" — April 6th and 11th

Dr. Kenneth Bailey continues comparing Psalm 23 with Luke 15 in this six-part video series as he looks at the person of Jesus and who He presents Himself to be. Jesus selected scriptures from the Old Testament and interpreted them with Himself at the center, revealing His identity as the Messiah. He used the 23rd Psalm as a model and out of it created the stories found in Luke, chapter 15. These include the Shepherd and the Lost Sheep, the Lost Coin, and the Prodigal Son. In the 23rd Psalm, the "table prepared in the presence of our enemies" affirms our celebration of communion in the midst of an evil world. And "dwelling in the house of the Lord for length of days" affirms that we are in the family of God wherever we go. The shepherd seeking the lost sheep affirms that Jesus, the Good Shepherd, seeks us out in order to return us to the safety of the fold. This and many other images from Psalm 23 tell us about the person of Jesus and our relationship with Him.

Identical one-hour sessions will be held on Wednesday the 6th at 7pm and Monday the 11th at 2pm in Founders' Hall. The 30-minute DVD is followed by a discussion of our reactions to Dr. Bailey's insights. Everyone is most welcome.
