Today We Welcome Rev. Dr. Esther Wakeman

Esther is vice-president for spiritual and community life at Payap University in Chiang Mai, the first Christian university in Thailand. "This is a time of great social stress and change, and the privilege of helping prepare young leaders for the country is a great responsibility and honor," she says. "Most of our staff and students are not Christian, but we live and work together in an educational institution established in the name of Christ. We have great opportunities to share God's love daily."

Planning Ahead

"Jesus Interprets His Own Person" — June 13th

Dr. Kenneth Bailey's six-part video series concludes this month with "Three Parables That Reveal Jesus' Person." These parables are The Good Samaritan, The Man Who Built His House Upon A Rock, and The Great Banquet. In each of these, Jesus has taken a familiar Old Testament passage and shaped it into a story with Himself at its center, thus pointing to Himself as the Messiah. In the first parable, Jesus takes Hosea, chapter 6, reshapes it by comparing Himself to a hated Samaritan and the last person you would expect as the agent of salvation. In the House on a Rock parable, Jesus takes from Isaiah 28 the concept of a tested and costly cornerstone around which the true foundation is built and applies it to Himself as the fulfillment of God's promise. In the last parable, Jesus draws on the banquet described in Isaiah 25 and states that even those beyond the Jewish community are invited.

A one-hour session will be held on Monday the 13th at 2:00pm in Founders' Hall. The 30-minute DVD is followed by a discussion of our reactions to Dr. Bailey's presentation. Everyone is most welcome.
