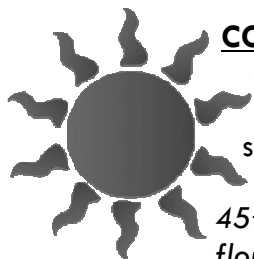


## Announcements

### “Jesus and His Vision of Mission” — August 8th

The current Bailey video series concludes this month with a presentation of “Flowers from the Valley of Terror” where Dr. Bailey shares some of his personal experiences in the Christian community during seven wars in the Middle East. He says that when a person comes out of such a valley of terror, he may hold in his hand a flower plucked from that valley. If he does, you will know that the soul has not lost the freshness of faith. As an example, one flower is that, potentially, suffering has the power to destroy us. But it also has the power to teach us to praise God because, if we don't, the damage continues. In the mystery of God's grace, if we can find how to praise God, the damage stops and we do not destroy ourselves. A one-hour session will be held on Tuesday the 8th at 12 noon in Founders' Hall. As always, we begin with a 30-minute DVD presentation, followed by informal sharing of our own reactions to Dr. Bailey's comments.
